Building Success with Early Learning Principles






Communication

Language develops through play as children practice vocabulary, communication, and expression in social interactions and role-playing scenarios.



Creativity

Creativity and innovation are developed through play as children explore new ideas, experiment with different approaches, and solve problems in imaginative ways. Play encourages risk-taking and thinking outside the box, fostering flexible and inventive thinking.



Critical Thinking

Critical thinking skills are developed through play as children analyze situations, make decisions, and evaluate outcomes based on their actions. Play encourages them to question, reason, and reflect, fostering deeper cognitive processing and logical thinking.



Problem-Solving


Problem-solving is developed through play as children encounter challenges, experiment with solutions, and learn to think critically about how to overcome obstacles. Play provides a safe space for trial and error, helping them build resilience and strategic thinking skills.



Interpersonal Skills

Interpersonal skills are developed through play as children learn to communicate, cooperate, and resolve conflicts with others. These interactions help them understand social cues, practice empathy, and build relationships, laying the foundation for effective teamwork and collaboration.

Importance of Kindergarten Readiness




- For children who enter kindergarten behind, **roughly 75%** will never catch up to their classmates.
- State and local **prekindergarten programs**, almost without exception, **improve academic readiness for school**.
- Participants in the prekindergarten program scored higher on third-grade language arts tests than did nonparticipants.
- Participation in an early childhood experience (child care or preschool) increases high school graduation rates.


Early Learning in Florida


2023 FAST PM 1 VPK Completer Results by County



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
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Statewide Percentage "Ready" = 51%

Intensive Support. Need more help? Sign up for FREE in-home support from one of our four local home visiting programs.












Leon County Schools Early Learning Programs

VPK ~300 students





The STEAM Stops is a mobile unit that "pops up" in neighborhoods where quality early learning experiences for children, birth to five, are not currently available, accessible or affordable. The primary focus is to reinforce 'parents as first teachers' by providing a two-generational approach to quality early learning. This includes delivering age-appropriate, play-based learning activities in an outdoor environment, coaching parents on how to participate and lead their child's learning, and connecting families to vital community resources based on their individual family needs.

Return on Investment: Every Dollar Invested Pays Off
