I. INTRODUCTION & GENERAL INFORMATION

The purpose and intent of this Invitation to Bid is to secure a firm price and to identify a qualified vendor to provide Exterior Door Glazing and Retrofit and ADA Lock Replacement for Springwood Elementary.

A Mandatory Pre-Bid walk-through will be held on March 23, 2015 at 10 a.m. at Springwood Elementary School, 3801 Fred George Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32303. All bidders or their representatives are to meet at the site in the front office and document attendance on the conference "sign-in" sheet. Attendees and District representatives will inspect the site and answer questions at that time.

II. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

NOTE: The term "Bidder" as used within this Invitation to Bid (ITB) refers to the person, company or organization responding to this ITB. The Bidder is responsible for understanding and complying with the terms and conditions herein.

- A. <u>GENERAL</u>: Upon a Bid award, the terms and conditions of this Bid or any portion thereof may upon mutual agreement of the parties be extended for an additional term(s) or for additional quantities (all original terms and conditions will remain in effect).
- B. <u>USE OF OTHER CONTRACTS:</u> The School Board reserve the right to utilize any other District contract, any State of Florida Contract, any contract awarded by any other City or County governmental agencies, any other School Board, any other Community College/State University system cooperative bid agreement, or to directly negotiate/purchase per School Board policy and/or State Board Rule 6A-1.012(6) in lieu of any offer received or award made as a result of this bid, If it is in the best interest to do so. The School Board also reserves the right to separately bid any single order or to purchase any item on this bid if it is in its best interest to do so.
- C. JOINT-BIDDING, COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT: All bidders submitting a response to this ITB agree that such response also constitutes a bid to all State Agencies and Political Subdivisions of the State of Florida under the same conditions, for the same prices and for the same effective period as this bid, should the bidder(s) deem it in the best interest of their business to do so. This agreement in no way restricts or interferes with any state agency or political subdivision of the State of Florida to rebid any or all items.

State agencies wishing to make purchases from this agreement are required to follow the provisions of s. 287.042(16) (a), F.S. This statute requires the Department of Management Services to determine that the requestor's use of the contract is cost-effective and in the best interest of the State.

Pursuant to their own governing laws, and subject to the agreement of the Contractor, other entities may be permitted to make purchases at the terms and conditions contained herein. Non-Customer purchases are independent of the agreement between Customer and Contractor, and Customer shall not be a party to any transaction between the Contractor and any other purchaser.

D. <u>AWARD</u>: In the event of contract award, this contract shall be awarded all or none to the responsible and responsive bidder whose bid is determined to be the most advantageous to the School Board, taking into consideration price and other requirements as set forth in this ITB. Any or all award(s) made as a result of this ITB shall conform to applicable School Board Rules, State Board Rules and State of Florida Statutes.

Once bids are evaluated, the Purchasing Department will post a Notice of Intent to Award by electronic posting at http://wwwold.leon.k12.fl.us/public/business/purchasing/Current%20News.htm on or about April 06, 2015 for a period of 72 hours or three business days, whichever is later. Failure to file a protest within the time prescribed in §120.57 Fla. Stat. shall constitute a waiver of proceedings.

It is anticipated that a recommendation for award will be presented to the School Board for consideration at its April 14, 2015 meeting.

E. <u>TERM</u>: The initial term of this contract will be after the date of the School Board approval, on or about **April 14, 2015.** All work for the building and site work shall be substantially complete within 45 calendar days from the date of the Notice-to-Proceed. Final completion shall occur within 30 calendar days from substantial completion. The successful vendor(s) agree to this condition by signing its bid.

- F. <u>BID OPENING AND FORM</u>: Bid openings will be public on the date and time specified on the Bidder's Acknowledgement form. All Bids received after the time indicated will be rejected as non-responsive and returned unopened to sender. Bids by Email, fax, telegram, or verbally by telephone or in person will not be accepted. To protect any confidential information contained in their Bid, companies must invoke the exemptions to disclosure provided by law in response to the ITB, and must identify the data and other material to be protected, and must state the reasons why such exclusion from public disclosure is necessary.
- G. <u>PUBLIC RECORDS LAW</u>: Pursuant to Florida Statutes Chapter 119.071(1), proposals received as a result of this ITB will not become public record until thirty (30) days after the date of opening or until posting of a recommendation for award, whichever occurs first. Thereafter, all proposal documents or other materials submitted by all Proposers in response to this ITB will be open for inspection by any person and in accordance with Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. To the extent a Bidder asserts any portion of its proposal is exempt or confidential from disclosure under Florida's public records, the burden shall be on the Proposer to obtain a protective order from a jurisdictional court protecting such information from disclosure under Florida's release of such information into the public domain.
- H. <u>BIDDER'S RESPONSIBILITY</u>: Before submitting their Bid, each bidder is required to carefully examine the ITB specifications and to completely familiarize themselves with all of the terms and conditions that are contained within this request. Ignorance on the part of the bidder will in no way relieve them of any of the obligations and responsibilities which are a part of this ITB.
- I. <u>OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE</u>: The contractor shall be responsible for obtaining and maintaining throughout the contract period any required occupational license and other licenses required pursuant to the laws of Leon County, the City of Tallahassee, or the State of Florida. Every contractor submitting a bid on this invitation for bids shall include a copy of the company's local business or occupational license(s) or a written statement on letterhead indicating the reason no license exists.
- J. <u>WARRANTY</u>: All goods and services furnished by the Bidder, relating to and pursuant to this ITB will be warranted to meet or exceed the Specifications contained herein. In the event of breach, the Bidder will take all necessary action, at Bidder's expense, to correct such breach in the most expeditious manner possible.
- K. <u>PRICING</u>: All pricing submitted will include all packaging, handling, shipping charges and delivery to any point within Leon County, Florida to a secure area or inside delivery. <u>The School Board is exempt and does not pay Federal Excise and State of Florida Sales taxes.</u>
- L. <u>QUANTITIES</u>: Quantities listed in the bid are estimates provided for bidder information purposes only. No guarantee is given or implied as to the exact quantities which will be purchased from this bid. The School Board reserves the right to increase or decrease all estimated quantities during the term of this contract or to delete any item or items as it deems appropriate, without affecting the bid pricing or the terms and conditions of the bid.
- M. <u>TERMS OF PAYMENT / INVOICING</u>: The normal terms of payment will be Net 30 Days from receipt and acceptance of goods or services and Bidder's invoice. Itemized invoices, each bearing the Purchase Order Number must be mailed on the day of shipment. Invoicing subject to cash discounts will be mailed on the day that they are dated.
- N. <u>PURCHASING CARDS</u>: The School Board may choose to use a "Purchasing Card" for ordering of goods and materials or payment of invoices under this contract. The Vendor, by submitting a proposal, agrees to accept this manner of payment and may not add additional handling charges or service fees to purchases made with the School Board's Purchasing Card(s). Refusal to accept this condition may cause the proposal to be declared non-responsive, or result in revocation of the contract, if already awarded. No third party payment, i.e. Pay pal will be considered
- O. <u>TRANSPORTATION AND TITLE</u>: (1) Title to the goods will pass to the School Board upon receipt and acceptance at the destination indicated herein. Until acceptance, the Bidder retains the sole insurable interest in the goods. (2) The shipper will prepay all transportation charges. The School Board will not accept collect freight charges. (3) No premium carriers will be used for the School Board's account without prior written consent of the Director of Purchasing.
- P. <u>PACKING</u>: All shipments will include an itemized list of each package's content, and reference the School Board's Purchase Order Number. No charges will be allowed for cartage or packing unless agreed upon by the School Board prior to shipment.

- Q. INSPECTIONS AND TESTING: The School Board will have the right to expedite, inspect and test any of the goods or work covered by this ITB. All goods or services are subject to the School Board's inspection and approval upon arrival or completion. If rejected, they will be held for disposal at the Bidder's risk. Such inspection, or the waiver thereof, however, will not relieve the Bidder from full responsibility for furnishing goods or work conforming to the requirements of this Bid or the Bid Specifications, and will not prejudice any claim, right, or privilege the School Board may have because of the use of defective or unsatisfactory goods or work.
- **R.** <u>STOP WORK ORDER</u>: The School Board may at any time, by written notice to the Bidder stop all or any part of the work for this Bid award. Upon receiving such notice, the Bidder will take all reasonable steps to minimize additional costs during the period of work stoppage. The School Board may subsequently either cancel the stop work order resulting in an equitable adjustment in the delivery schedule and/or the price, or terminate the work in accordance with the provisions of the Bid terms and conditions.
- S. <u>INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION</u>: The Bidder agrees to indemnify and save harmless the School Board, its officers, agents and employees from and against any and all claims and liabilities (including expenses) for injury or death of persons or damage to any property which may result, in whole or in part, from any act or omission on the part of the Bidder, its agents, employees, or representatives, or are arising from any Bidder furnished goods or services, except to the extent that such damage is due solely and directly to the negligence of the School Board. The Bidder will carry comprehensive general liability insurance, including contractual and product liability coverage, with minimum limits acceptable to the School Board. The Bidder will, at the request of the School Board, supply certificates evidencing such coverage and listing the Leon County School Board as "Additional Insured" on said policies.
- T. <u>RISK OF LOSS</u>: The Bidder assumes the following risks: (1.) all risks of loss or damage to all goods, work in process, materials and equipment until the delivery thereof as herein provided; (2.) all risks of loss or damage to third persons and their property until delivery of all goods as herein provided; (3.) all risks of loss or damage to any property received by the Bidder or held by the Bidder or its suppliers for the account of the School Board, until such property has been delivered to the School Board; (4) all risks of loss or damage to any of the goods or part thereof rejected by the School Board, from the time of shipment thereof to Bidder until redelivery thereof to the School Board.
- U. <u>LAWS AND REGULATIONS</u>: Bidders will comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local laws, statutes and ordinances including, but not limited to the rules, regulations and standards of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970, the Federal Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the Fair Labor Standards Act, the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act, Chapter 440, Florida Statutes, and the rules and regulations promulgated there under. Bidders agree not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, sex, religion, color, age, disability or national origin.

All agreements as a result of an award hereto and all extensions and modifications thereto and all questions relating to its validity, interpretation, performance or enforcement shall be governed and construed in conformance to the laws of the State of Florida.

- V. <u>PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES</u>: A Bidder, person, or affiliate who has been placed on the convicted vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with any public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of the threshold amount provided in Florida State Statute, Section 287.017, for CATEGORY TWO for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list.
- W. <u>PATENTS AND COPYRIGHTS</u>: Bidders agree to indemnify and save harmless the School Board, its officers, employees, agents, or representatives using the goods specified herein from any loss, damage or injury arising out of a claim or suit at law or equity for actual or alleged infringement of letters of patent by reason of the buying, selling or using the goods supplied under this bid, and will assume the defense of any and all suits and will pay all costs and expenses thereto.

X. FUNDING OUT/CANCELATION OR TERMINATION WITH OR WITHOUT CAUSE:

- a. <u>WITH CAUSE:</u> In the event any of the provisions of the Contract are violated by the bidder, the Superintendent or designee shall give written notice to the bidder stating the deficiencies and unless the deficiencies are corrected within ten days, recommendation will be made to the School Board or its designee for immediate cancellation. Upon cancellation, hereunder the School Board may pursue any and all legal remedies as provided herein and by law. In the event that it is subsequently determined that a cancellation under this paragraph was incorrect, the termination shall be converted to a termination for convenience pursuant to the next paragraph.
- b. WITHOUT CAUSE: The School Board or its designee reserves the right to terminate any contract resulting from this Invitation to Bid at any time and for no reason whatsoever, upon giving 30 days prior written notice to the bidder. If the Contract should be terminated for convenience as provided herein, the School Board shall be relieved of all obligations under said Contract. The School Board or its designee shall only be required to pay to the successful bidder that amount of the Contract actually performed to the date of termination.
- c. **FUNDING OUT:** Florida School Laws prohibit the School Board or its designee from creating obligations on anticipation of budgeted revenues from one fiscal year to another without year-to-year extension provisions in the contracts.

It is necessary that fiscal funding out provisions be included in all bids in which the terms are for periods of longer than one year.

Therefore, the following funding out provisions are an integral part of this Invitation to Bid and must be agreed to by all bidders:

The School Board or its designee may, during the contract period, terminate or discontinue the items covered in this bid for lack of appropriated funds upon the same terms and conditions.

Such prior written notice will state:

1. That the lack of appropriated funds is the reason for termination, and

2. School Board agrees not to replace the equipment or services being terminated with equipment and services with functions similar to those performed by the equipment covered in this bid from another vendor in the succeeding funding period.

"This written notification will thereafter release the School Board of Leon County, Florida of all further obligations in any way related to such equipment covered herein".

- Y. <u>AUDITS, RECORDS, AND RECORDS RETENTION</u>: The School Board or its representative reserves the right to inspect and/or audit all the Bidder's documents and records as they pertain to the products and services delivered under this agreement. Such rights will be exercised with notice to the Bidder to determine compliance with and performance of the terms, conditions and specifications on all matters, rights and duties, and obligations established by this agreement. Documents/records in any form shall be open to the School Board's representative and may include but are not limited to all correspondence, ordering, payment, inspection and receiving records, and contracts or sub-contracts that directly or indirectly pertain to the transactions between the School Board and the Bidder.
 - 1. To establish and maintain books, records, and documents (including electronic storage media) in accordance with generally accepted accounting procedures and practices, which sufficiently and properly reflect all revenues and expenditures of funds provided by the School Board under this contract.
 - 2. To retain all contractor records, financial records, supporting documents, statistical records, and any other documents (including electronic storage media) pertinent to this contract for a period of five (5) years after termination of the contract, or if an audit has been initiated and audit findings have not been resolved at the end of five (5) years, the records shall be retained until resolution of the audit findings or any litigation which may be based on the terms of this contract.
 - **3.** Upon completion or termination of the contract and at the request of the School Board, the Contractor will cooperate with the School Board to facilitate the duplication and transfer of any said records or documents during the required retention period as specified in paragraph 1 above.
 - 4. To assure that these records shall be subject at all reasonable times to inspection, review, or audit by Federal, state, or other personnel duly authorized by the School Board.
 - 5. Persons duly authorized by the School Board and Federal auditors, pursuant to Title 45, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 92.36 (I) (10), and Title 34, Section 80.36(i), shall have full access to and the right to examine any of provider's contract and related records and documents, regardless of the form in which kept, at all reasonable times for as long as records are retained
 - 6. To include these aforementioned audit and record keeping requirements in all approved subcontracts and assignments.

- Z. <u>WEAPONS AND FIREARMS</u>: The School Board prohibits any contractor from possessing, storing, making, or using a weapon, including a concealed weapon, on School Board property and any setting that is under the control and supervision of the School Board as specified in School Board Policy 7217. Violations will be subject to the immediate termination of the contract.
- AA. <u>LEVEL 2 SCREENING REQUIREMENTS</u>: The following provisions, which implement the requirements of School Board Policy 8475, Florida Statute Sections 1012.315, 1012.32, 1012.465 (Jessica Lunsford Act), 1012.467 and 1012.468 are included as additional terms and conditions of the contract:

Finger Printing and Background Check:

The vendor/contractor agrees to comply with all requirements of School Board Policy 8475 and Florida Statute Sections 1012.315, 1012.32, 1012.465 (Jessica Lunsford Act), 1012.467 and 1012.468 by certifying that any/all employees have completed the mandatory background screenings as required by the referenced policy and statutes and shall provide the School Board with proof of compliance. These certifications will be provided to the Leon County School Board, Safety & Security Department in advance of the vendor/contractor providing any/all services as required herein. The vendor/contractor will bear the cost of acquiring the background screening required and any/all fees imposed by the Florida Department of Law Enforcement and or the School Board to maintain the fingerprints provided with respect to vendor/contractor and its employees. Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the School Board, its officers, agents and employees from any liability in the form of physical injury, death, or property damage resulting from the Contractor's failure to comply with the requirements of these cited policies and statutes. The vendor/contractor will follow procedures for obtaining employees background screening as established by the Leon County School Board, Safety & Security Department.

- **BB.** <u>**RECIPROCITY OF FLORIDA SCHOOL I.D. BADGES:** If contractor has a Level II clearance registered with another Florida School Board, they may be able to obtain a Leon County School Board vendor i.d. badge. Contractor should check with the Safety & Security Department Fingerprint Services office to verify clearance and obtain a vendor i.d. badge.</u>
- CC. <u>CONTACT WITH STUDENTS</u>: No employees or independent contractors, material men, suppliers or anyone involved in any manner with projects resulting from this proposal shall have direct or indirect contact with students at project sites. A violation of this provision shall result in immediate termination of the offender and issuance of a trespass notice from the School Board. Vendor/Proposer shall be responsible for insuring compliance by all employees, independent contractors and sub-contractors or other persons involved in any manner with projects resulting from this proposal.
- DD. <u>SAMPLES AND BRAND NAMES</u>: Specifications referencing specific brand names and models are used to reflect the kind and type of quality in materials and workmanship, and the corresponding level of performance the School Board expect to receive as a minimum. Bidders offering equivalents or superior products to the brand/model specified will be considered. The School Board reserves the right to determine the acceptability of any alternatives offered.
- EE. EVALUATION CRITERIA: Primary factors used to decide the award hereunder will be price, availability and responsiveness. Other factors that may be used in the evaluation of this bid will be: (1.) administrative costs incurred by the School Board in association with the discharge of any subsequent award; (2.) alternative payment terms; (3.) Bidder's past performance. The School Board reserves the right to evaluate by lot, by partial lot, or by item, and to accept or reject any bid in its entirety or in part, and to waive minor irregularities if the bid is otherwise valid. In the event of a price extension error, the unit price will be accepted as correct. The School Board has sole discretion in determining testing and evaluation methods.

- FF. CLARIFICATIONS AND INTERPRETATIONS: The School Board reserves the right to allow for clarification of questionable entries, and for the Bidder to withdraw items with obvious mistakes. Any questions concerning terms, conditions or specifications will be directed to the designated Purchasing Agent referenced on the ITB Acknowledgement. Any ambiguities or inconsistencies shall be brought to the attention of the designated Purchasing Agent in writing at least seven workdays prior to the opening date of the Bid. Failure to do so, on the part of the bidder will constitute an acceptance by the bidder of consequent decision. An addendum to the ITB shall be issued and posted for those interpretations that may affect the eventual outcome of this bid. It is the bidder's responsibility to assure the receipt of all addendum issued. No person is authorized to give oral interpretations of, or make oral changes to the Bid. Therefore oral statements given before the bid opening date will not be binding. The School Board will consider no interpretations binding unless provided for by issuance of an addendum. The bidder shall acknowledge receipt of all addenda by signing and enclosing said addenda with their proposal.
- **GG.** <u>DISPUTE:</u> In case of any doubt or difference of opinion as to the items to be furnished hereunder, the decision of the School Board shall be final and binding on both parties. In the event a dispute occurs, or a clarification of contract terms becomes necessary, please indicate your company representative for arbitration proceedings.

Failure to file a notice of protest or to file a formal written protest within the time prescribed by Section 120.57(3), Florida Statutes, shall constitute a waiver of proceedings under Chapter 120, Florida Statutes and School Board Policy 6320.02.

П. **PROTESTS TO CONTRACT AWARD**: The School Board shall provide notice of a decision or intended decision concerning a solicitation, contract award, or exceptional purchase by electronic posting which can be accessed at the Purchasing Department's website http://wwwold.leon.k12.fl.us/public/business/purchasing/Current%20News.htm. - A. <u>CONTRACT</u>: The submission of your bid constitutes a firm offer by the bidder. Upon acceptance by the School Board, the Purchasing Department will issue a notice of award and purchase order(s) for any supplies, equipment and/or services as a result of this bid. The Invitation to Bid and the corresponding purchase order(s) will constitute the complete agreement between the successful bidder and the School Board. Unless otherwise stipulated in the bid documents or agreed to in writing by both parties, no other contract documents shall be issued or accepted.
- **B.** <u>FIRM OFFER</u>: Any bid may be withdrawn until the date and time set for the opening of the bids. Any bid not so withdrawn shall constitute an irrevocable offer to provide the School Board the services/products set forth in this ITB. Such offer shall be held open for a period of sixty (60) days from ITB opening date or until one of the bids has been awarded by the School Board.
- C. <u>RESERVATION FOR REJECTION OR AWARD</u>: The School Board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive irregularities or technicalities, and to request rebids. All questions concerning the validity, operation, interpretation, construction and enforcement of any terms, covenants or conditions of this contract shall in all respects be governed by and determined in accordance with the laws of the State of Florida without giving effect to the choice of law principles thereof and unless otherwise preempted by federal law.

- **M.** <u>CHARTER SCHOOLS</u>: Items or services awarded under this contract shall be made available to Charter Schools approved by the School Board. The School Board is not responsible or liable for purchases that may be made by Charter Schools.
- N. <u>COMPLIANCE WITH SCHOOL CODE</u>: Bidder agrees to comply with all sections of the Florida K-20 Education Code, Title XLVIII, Florida Statutes as it presently exists and further as it may be amended from time to time. Further, Contractor agrees that failure to comply with the Florida K-20 Education Code shall constitute a material breach of this Contract and may result in the termination of this Contract by the School Board.

O. <u>PRICE ESCALATION</u>: In the event of unforeseen circumstances that directly impact the pricing and/or servicing of this contract, the School Board reserves the right to negotiate the established bid price with the contractor at any time during the duration of this contract after completion of the initial contract term. - B. <u>PRE-BID CONFERENCE:</u> A MANDATORY pre-bid conference will be held at <u>Springwood Elementary School 3801 Fred George</u> <u>Road, Tallahassee, Florida 32303 March 23, 2015 at 10:00am</u>. Attendance at the walk-thru is part of the requirement of this solicitation. All prospective bidders are to meet at the school site in the front office and document attendance on the conference "sign-in" sheet. Attendees and the District personnel will thoroughly inspect the site and further explain the service requirements and answer any questions at that time. Proposals will be accepted and evaluated only from those vendors that are present at the walk-thru. Failure to attend may be cause for disqualification.
- C. <u>BIDDER RESPONSIBILITIES</u>: It is the bidder's responsibility to become fully informed as to the nature and extent of the work required and its relation to any work in the area, including but not limited to quantity, size, weight, gauge and or type of materials required, as well as accessibility to the site and or possible interference from academics or other school activities. Each bidder is required to carefully examine the Invitation to Bid delivery schedule, bid prices and extensions, insurance requirements, licensing requirements, bid closing date and time and to completely familiarize itself with all of the terms and conditions that are contained within the Invitation to Bid. Failure to do so on the part of the bidder will in no way relieve it of any of the obligations and responsibilities which are a part of the Invitation to Bid.
- **D.** <u>**BIDDER QUALIFICATIONS**</u>: Bidders may be required to furnish evidence in writing that they maintain a permanent place of business and have adequate equipment, finances and personnel to perform the services of this contract. - **G. INSPECTION OF WORK:** The District reserves the right to inspect the contractor's work at any time to assure compliance with all terms and conditions of this Agreement. All work will be inspected pursuant to conditions of this agreement. All deficiencies noted by the District will be submitted to the contractor for correction within ten (10) calendar days after submission of deficiencies to the contractor. An inspection of the work may be conducted to insure corrective action was taken.
- H. <u>DAMAGE TO DISTRICT OWNED PROPERTY</u>: Any damage to property, equipment, grounds, buildings, etc. that is caused by the awarded contractor will be reported to the District within twenty-four (24) hours of discovery. The awarded contractor will have ten (10) working days after report to present its written response to the claimed damages. The awarded contractor, upon approval by an authorized District representative, may make repairs that are deemed within its capability. The District reserves the right to make immediate repairs to correct damages that are safety hazards or that pose a detrimental effect to the District's operations. Costs of any replacement or repairs made by the District for damages caused by the awarded contractor shall be deducted from any monies due to the contractor. This shall not prevent the District from seeking damages should replacement/repair costs exceed the amount of monies owed to the awarded contractor.

- I. <u>SAFETY</u>: The awarded contractor shall take all reasonable precautions for safety and shall provide all reasonable protection to prevent damage, injury or loss to persons and employees of the District. The awarded contractor shall comply with all Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) regulations, as they relate to, and are applicable to the performance of the work of this contract.
- J. <u>EMERGENCIES</u>: In any emergency affecting the safety of persons and property, the awarded contractor shall act immediately to prevent threatened damage, injury or loss. Any emergency must be reported to an authorized District representative immediately and no later than twenty-four (24) hours from the time that the emergency is discovered by the contractor

Violation of this provision may result in removal of the individual(s) involved from the school site, the project, and further, the vendor may be prohibited from employing the individual in any future work with the District.
- **O.** <u>CONTRACTOR ACCESSIBLITY</u>: Contractor shall be accessible by a Leon County toll free local telephone call during regular business hours. Local off-hours answering service for emergencies shall be available for contractor notification twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days per week, all year, including holidays.
- P. <u>STOPPAGE OF WORK:</u> The District reserves the right to stop work on any project if, in the opinion of the District's Authorized Representative:
 - 1. Materials or work are not in conformance with applicable codes, standards, District specifications and/or accepted practices.
 - 2. The contractor's activities result in damage to District property.
 - 3. The contractor's activities interfere with the normal operation of the facility.
 - 4. Contractor's personnel are not properly licensed to perform the work or as it pertains to school facilities the contractor's personnel have not received their Level II background clearances.
 - 5. Any other condition, situation, or circumstance, which in the opinion of the District Authorized Representative would be a detriment to the best interests of the District if allowed to persist.

Q. SUBCONTRACTING:

The awarded contractor(s) shall be the primary service provider(s) and shall perform all requested inspections and repairs. Subcontracting for these base services is not allowed.

- 2. Any work or service to be performed by a subcontractor must have the prior approval of the District. The District reserves the right to reject any subcontractor. Rejection of any subcontractor shall not entitle the contractor to adjustment of bid prices. 4. DOOR LIGHT FRAME:

- a. The glass shall be held in place with a low profile door light frame model No, 118 manufactured by all metal stamping Inc. or an approved alternate. Submit proposed alternates for review and approval prior to bid.
- b. The kit shall be so that the exposed glass is no less that the existing exposed area (approximately 51/2 x 57")
- c. New trim kit shall be placed to cover the existing screw holes in the door. Coordinate the placement of the trim with the new lock and lever escutcheon plate.
- d. The door light finish shall be selected by the school board.
- e. The contractor shall cut door as required to install the trim kit but shall not exceed the maximum edge distance recommended by the manufacture.

5. LEVER AND LOCK:

- a. Replace the existing door lever and locks with Schlage levers.
- b. The number of doors to receive new hardware and the hardware model selection will be made at the mandatory prebid meeting March 23, 2015.

6. QUALITY ASSURANCE:

a. Installer's qualifications: not less than three (3) years experience with comparable scale projects.

7. EXECUTION:

- a. Verify that openings for glazing are correctly sized and are within tolerance.
- b. Protect glass edges from damage during handling and installation.
- c. Glass and trim kit shall be installed per the manufacturer's recommendations.
- d. Replace damaged glass where encountered. Damaged glass is defined as glass with edge damage or other imperfections that, when installed, could weaken glass and impair performance and appearance.


