
A Material World



Made to Order

Materials are natural or human-made. **Natural** materials are found in nature. For example, cotton is from a plant. Wood is from trees. Metal is in rocks.

People make human-made materials such as plastics and nylon. Scientists first made them in a lab. Scientists changed petroleum into these new materials not found in nature.


