Required Summer Reading Assignment—2024

Welcome to Advanced Placement Literature and Composition. This course requires you to read, analyze, and discuss literature in depth and to write about literature in a manner that demonstrates knowledge and critical thinking abilities across various literary genres. The works listed below should be available at local libraries, but we encourage you to obtain a personal copy that will allow you to highlight and write in the works as you desire. **We will be using hard copies (not electronic copies) of both works listed below.**

LITERARY WORKS

Read both works listed below and complete the note-taking assignment. [Notes on these novels are to be handwritten and in your own words—no notes from other sources except where noted; 3-5 pgs. min. for each work.] Due date for notes and rewrite of story: the first day of class.

- **1. Novel:** *Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus* by Mary Shelley. You may read the 1818 or 1831 edition. Notes must include the following:
 - list of characters with descriptions
 - plot summary (min: 150 words)
 - characteristics of Romanticism (provide source) and two examples (direct quotations) from the novel
 - characteristics of Gothic literature (provide source) and two examples (direct quotations) from the novel
 - definition of a frame narrative (provide source) and explanation of the use (direct quotations) and effect of the device in this novel
 - themes (in sentence form) with direct quotations from the text for support

2. Short story: "A&P" by John Updike

Rewrite the short story from two new perspectives: a third-person narrative and a character of your choice (min: 300 words each). Be prepared to explain, with specific examples, how changing the perspective changes our understanding/analysis of the text.
