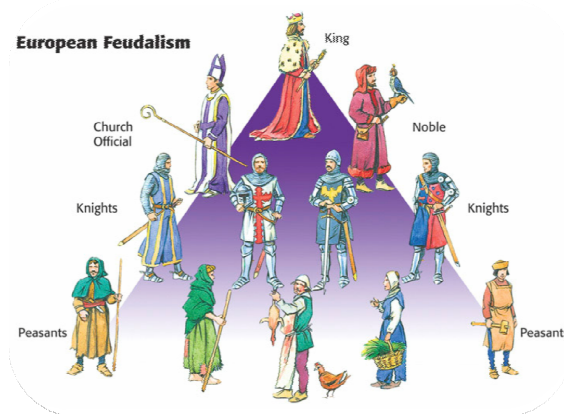
### Vikings

## Castles

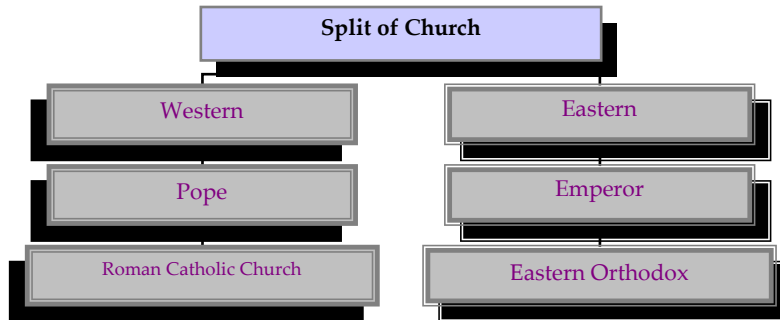
- Lords \_\_\_\_\_ homes to withstand attack

## England & France Develop 800-1500

### Strong Monarchs in England

- The Anglo-Saxon King \_\_\_\_\_ died w/out an heir.
- 2 people claim the throne:
  - \_\_\_\_\_, **Edward's brother-in-law**
  - **Duke** \_\_\_\_\_ **of Normandy**
- William raised an army and had the backing of the \_\_\_\_\_.
- Battle of Hastings – William sailed across the English Channel and \_\_\_\_\_

### Henry II

- In 1154, Henry II inherited the throne
- Broadened the system of royal \_\_\_\_\_
- Royal Court's decisions became the basis for English \_\_\_\_\_ Law
- In time people accepted it over the courts of the \_\_\_\_\_ or nobles
- \_\_\_\_\_ determined which cases went to trial

### A Tragic Clash

- Henry's efforts with royal courts led to a bitter conflict with the \_\_\_\_\_
- Henry claimed the right to try \_\_\_\_\_ in royal courts
- Thomas \_\_\_\_\_, archbishop of Canterbury, opposed this
- In 1170, 4 of Henry's knights \_\_\_\_\_ Becket in his own cathedral

### The Magna Carta

- Henry's son, \_\_\_\_\_, was a clever but untrustworthy ruler.
- Eventually \_\_\_\_\_ his own nobles (taxes)
- 1215- rebellious barons forced John to sign the \_\_\_\_\_
  - Two basic ideas
    1. \_\_\_\_\_ had certain rights
    2. Monarchs had to obey the \_\_\_\_\_
  - King also agreed to not raise new \_\_\_\_\_ w/out consulting the Great Council of Lords and Clergy

### “THE HUNDRED YEAR’S WAR & THE PLAGUE”

#### THE BLACK DEATH

- 1347- \_\_\_\_\_ Plague raged through Italy
- 1348- reached Spain & \_\_\_\_\_

#### A GLOBAL EPIDEMIC

- Had broken out before in Europe, Asia, and North Africa –then died down
