### The United Nations

- April 1945 - delegates from \_\_\_\_\_ nations met in San Francisco to draft the UN charter
- Each nation gets one vote in the \_\_\_\_\_

### Allies Become Enemies

- US & USSR would become tense rival \_\_\_\_\_

  - Stalin's goals

### Containing Communism

- U.S. abandoned its \_\_\_\_\_ policy

- Unpopular

## Chapter 33 Section 4 “Cold War Divides the World”

### The \_\_\_\_\_ Race

- 1957 – \_\_\_\_\_ (Soviet Satellite) - Caused U.S. to increase spending on technology
- 1961 – Yuri \_\_\_\_\_ (USSR) - 1<sup>st</sup> \_\_\_\_\_ in space
- 1961 – Alan \_\_\_\_\_ (USA) - JFK \_\_\_\_\_
- 1969 – Apollo \_\_\_\_\_ - mission to the moon

### Cuba

- \_\_\_\_\_ World – developing nations in Latin America, Asia, and Africa (not aligned with U.S. or U.S.S.R.)
- 1950's – \_\_\_\_\_ was ruled by an unpopular dictator with U.S. support
- 1959 – \_\_\_\_\_ led a revolution
- Castro was a harsh dictator that nationalized the Cuba economy
  - Took over U.S.-owned \_\_\_\_\_
- U.S. \_\_\_\_\_ on all trade w/ Cuba
- Castro turned to the \_\_\_\_\_ for aid
- Bay of \_\_\_\_\_ invasion humiliated the U.S. - U.S. viewed as weak

### Cuban Missile Crisis

- \_\_\_\_\_ secretly began to build 42 missile sites in Cuba
- An American \_\_\_\_\_ discovered the sites
- Pres. \_\_\_\_\_ demanded their removal
- Nikita \_\_\_\_\_ removed the missiles & the U.S. promised not to invade Cuba

## Nicaragua

- 1979 – Communist \_\_\_\_\_ rebels overthrew the Nicaraguan dictatorship
- The Sandinistas aided Marxist rebels in \_\_\_\_\_
- The \_\_\_\_\_ supported Nicaraguan anti-Communist forces called Contras
- Civil war lasted a \_\_\_\_\_
- 1990 – free elections

## Iran

- U.S. helped restore the \_\_\_\_\_ to power

  - Shah fled Iran

  - Iran (Islamic radicals) vs. Iraq (secular) war
