#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The curriculum will be based on the Florida Mathematics Standards. Concepts within each grade are organized in units that align to major domains and provide focus on key big ideas. Within each unit, concepts are organized into modules that align to clusters and build connections among the standards. Our series, *HMH Florida Go Math*, is designed to provide coherent and focused progressions across the grades.

Ratios& Proportionality: Analyze proportional relationships and use them to solve real-world and

mathematical problems.

The Number System: Apply and extend previous understandings of operations with fractions to add, subtract,

multiply and divide rational numbers.

**Expressions & Equations:** Use properties of operations to generate equivalent expressions.

Solve real-life and mathematical problems using numerical and algebraic expressions

and equations.

**Geometry:** Draw, construct and describe geometrical figures and describe the relationships between them.

Solve real-life and mathematical problems involving angle measure, area, surface area, and volume.

Statistics & Probability: Use random sampling to draw inferences about a population.

Draw informal comparative inferences about two populations.

Investigate chance processes and develop, use, and evaluate probability models.

Students are able to go online to access all unit resources. We have gone digital with our write-in student edition which is accessible on any device. The Personal Math Trainer, at **my.hrw.com** will give immediate feedback and help as students work through practice sets.

#### **CITIZENSHIP**

#### Classroom Procedures

**REQUIRED MATERIALS.** Bring the following materials to class **each day**:

\*Case It

\*two sharpened pencils

\*ruled paper

**ENTERING THE CLASSROOM**. We enter the classroom in a calm, quiet manner, once you are in, you **MAY NOT** leave out, unless otherwise permitted. Sharpen your pencil if necessary, take a seat and begin Warm-up assignment. Remember: Once the tardy bell rings, you must be in your seat and working. (That means having the necessary materials out on your desk.)

Case It - This is an important tool. Bring it to class with you every single day.

**ATTENTION SIGNAL.** When I hold up my hand I will say, "Give me five." That means the entire class should be absolutely silent and still within 5 seconds.

**ASKING QUESTIONS -LEAVING YOUR SEAT-GETTING HELP**. You must <u>Raise your hand</u> and I will acknowledge you.

**CLASSROOM BEHAVIOR.** Your responsibilities in this class are to: be on time, be prepared, and be productive. When in group, ALL team members are expected to be polite and respectful to one another---and that includes the teacher. **No student will be allowed to disrupt the learning of his or her classmates.** 

**MAKEUP WORK.** When you are absent you are expected to make up any work you missed. On the day you return, it is your responsibility to check the appropriate folder for any missed work.

**HOMEWORK.** Homework, when assigned, will be **due** at the **beginning** of class. Have it out on your desk ready to be checked or picked up.

**TURNING IN WORK.** All work other than homework, is to be placed in the appropriate class bin before leaving the classroom.

**END OF CLASS DISMISSAL.** Two minutes before class ends, I will tell you to start getting packed up. We will straighten the room. Then, I will give you any last minute instructions and the teacher will dismiss you, NOT the bell.

**TARDINESS.** You are expected to be *in your seat* when the tardy bell rings. If you come in late and do not have a pass, quietly sign the tardy sheet at the front of the room. You are allowed three unexcused tardies for each nine weeks. The fourth unexcused tardy results in a referral and a call home. If you are late (unexcused) for more than 5 minutes, this is not a tardy. You are considered to be "skipping" and you will be given an automatic referral.

**RESTROOM PASSES.** You are expected to use the restroom between classes. *No* restroom passes (or any passes) will be issued during DEADTIME - the first or last ten minutes of class nor during instructional time.
