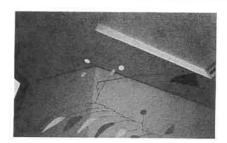

**Assignment #4** 







Overview and Purpose: You are currently living an important part of history! Years from now, the COVID-19 pandemic will be in history books and you will be able to say, "I was there when it happened!" For this project, you are to create a visual work of art reflecting the current event. What is your intake on how people are handling the pandemic? What problems or solutions do you think there are? What do you think about America's response to the outbreak? How has your schedule changed? Do you feel like life will return to "normal" or do you feel like there will be major changes? If so, what? When will this pandemic end? How will it go on?

- <u>Don't write about it!</u> **Draw** illustrations as a response!
- You can use 2D OR 3D techniques, meaning you can draw on a piece of paper or make a sculpture using the supplies you have at home.
- Remember, you are an artist! How you respond is entirely up to you. You can make a negative or positive visual response. If you are having a hard time deciding, reach out to me and we can discuss it!

**Objective:** Students will learn that expression in artworks can sometimes be found in the presentation of the subject matter. Students will explore how lines and shapes can express emotions. Students will communicate a variety of emotions using line, shape and values to create form.

#### Materials:

- 8"x11" paper or larger (You can use any type of paper)
- Any medium (pencil, pen, cardboard, paper, color pencil, toothpicks, etc.)
- Other supplies you can find at home-BE CREATIVE!

#### **Submitting Your Work:**

- Take a photo of your finished work
  - 1. Go outside when it's sunny or cloudy (NOT RAINY)
  - 2. Put the image on the ground
  - 3. Take a photo directly above the artwork or take multiple photos around the sculpture
  - 4. Use editing tools to crop the image
