2. microbes [Noun]

Definition: a microorganism, especially a bacterium causing disease or fermentation.

3. colony [Noun]

Sentence: The colony of ants collected food together. Definition: a community of living things Synonyms: community

 Definition: organs or devices for detecting something
- radiation [Noun]
 Sentence: Radiation from the sun keeps the planet warm.
 Definition: energy given out by atoms
 Synonyms: emanation, emission
- rovers [Noun] Sentence: Rovers wander and ramble aimlessly. Definition: people who wander Synonyms: wanderers, nomads
- meteorology [Noun]
 Sentence: The weatherman studied meteorology in school.
 Definition: the science of weather and atmosphere
 Synonyms: climatology

8. photocopy [Noun]

Sentence: I made a photocopy, or duplicate, of the test. Definition: a copy of printed or written material Synonyms: copy, duplicate

9. ecology [Noun]

Sentence: Ecology is the study of animals and habitats. Definition: science of organisms and their environment

10. geometric [Adjective]

Sentence: Squares and triangles are geometric shapes. Definition: relating to shapes, lines, points and angles

11. synchronize [Verb]

Sentence: Let's synchronize schedules so they match. Definition: to make things coordinate with each other Antonyms: mismatch, disorder Synonyms: coordinate, harmonize

12. parameter [Noun] Sentence: Temperature is a measurable parameter. Definition: one of a set of measurable factors

13. chronology [Noun]

Sentence: A chronology lists when events happened. Definition: a list of events in a time sequence Synonyms: timeline

14. symbiotic [Adjective]

Sentence: The two species benefit from each other in a symbiotic relationship. Definition: having two-way relationship that benefits each

15. photogenic [Adjective]

Sentence: A photogenic girl looks pretty on film. Definition: quality of looking attractive on film

16. geography [Noun]

Sentence: We study geography using maps of the world.

Definition: study of natural features of Earth's surface

17. symmetry [Noun]

Sentence: A butterfly's balanced wings have symmetry. Definition: an exact correspondence in position or form Antonyms: asymmetry, unevenness Synonyms: proportion, balance, equality, correspondence

18. geocentric [Adjective]

Sentence: Geocentric studies revolve around the earth. Definition: related to the earth as focal point Antonyms: heliocentric

19. chronological [Adjective]

Sentence: I listed the dates in chronological order. Definition: arranged by order in time or by date Antonyms: random, intermittent Synonyms: temporal, sequential, consecutive

20. odometer [Noun]

Sentence: The odometer measured how far we drove. Definition: device to measure distance traveled

21. chronic [Adjective]

Sentence: I have a chronic cough that won't go away. Definition: persisting for a long time or recurring Antonyms: acute, temporary, one time Synonyms: persistent, habitual, continuing, ongoing, constant

22. photocell [Noun]

Sentence: There are three types of photocell; the photoemissive cell, the photovoltaic cell, and the photoconductive cell. Definition: a sensor that changes its resistance when light shines on it

23. biosphere [Noun]

Sentence: The earth's biosphere is where life exists. Definition: the environment where life exists 24. speedometer [Noun]

Sentence: The speedometer tells me how fast I drive. Definition: device for indicating one's rate of speed

25. geology [Noun]

Sentence: She collects rocks and studies geology. Definition: the study of the rocks and soil of the earth

32. passage [Noun] Sentence: A tunnel allows passage under water. Definition: a route, corridor or pathway for traveling Synonyms: way

33. adventure [Noun]

Sentence: I prefer an adventure to boredom and safety. Definition: an exciting and dangerous experience Synonyms: venture, escapade, exploit, caper

34. curious [Adjective]

Sentence: I am curious to find out your secret. Definition: eager to find out something Antonyms: uninterested Synonyms: inquisitive, interested, wondering
