1. peering [Verb]
Sentence: I'm peering into the window to see who's home.
Definition: searching, looking intently; showing partly
Synonyms: searching
2. via [Preposition]
Sentence: I will send the numbers via email.
Definition: by way of
Synonyms: through
3. traversed [Verb]
Sentence: The men traversed the desert on camels.
Definition: moved across or through
Synonyms: crossed, passed, covered
4. girth [Noun]
Sentence: Circumference is the girth of an object.
Definition: the distance around a person or thing
Synonyms: circumference, perimeter
5. intersecting [Adjective]
Sentence: The intersecting lines form a right angle.
Definition: dividing by meeting or crossing at some point
Synonyms: meeting, crossing
6. advisable [Adjective]
Sentence: Crossing the street carefully is advisable.
Definition: recommended to do
Synonyms: desirable, recommended
7. noticeable [Adjective]
Sentence: The rip was hidden, so it was not noticeable.
Definition: able to be seen
Antonyms: indistinguishable, invisible, hidden

Synonyms: observable, visible, obvious

8. workable [Adjective]

Sentence: A workable solution makes a job possible.

Definition: able to be solved or figured out

Antonyms: impossible

Synonyms: doable, solvable

9. credible [Adjective]

Sentence: He is a credible boy, so I trust his story.

Definition: easy to believe or able to trust

Synonyms: believable

10. forcible [Adjective]

Sentence: Forcible restraint was to hold back the crowd.

Definition: involving the use of strong compulsion

Synonyms: violent, coercive, aggressive

11. available [Adjective]

Sentence: The full bus has no available seats.

Definition: able to be reached, used, or bought

Antonyms: unavailable, engaged, full, busy

Synonyms: accessible, empty, free, obtainable, vacant

12. combustible [Adjective]

Sentence: Gasoline is combustible and catches fire fast.

Definition: capable of catching fire and burning

Antonyms: non-flammable

Synonyms: flammable, inflammable

13. justifiable [Adjective]

Sentence: The sound decision was a justifiable one.

Definition: having good reason

Antonyms: unreasonable

Synonyms: reasonable, defensible

14. accountable [Adjective]

Sentence: I am accountable, or liable, for my actions.

Definition: responsible to someone for an action

Antonyms: irresponsible

Synonyms: responsible, answerable

15. considerable [Adjective]

Sentence: An ox has considerable strength.

Definition: a large or important amount

Antonyms: small, insignificant, paltry

Synonyms: great, large, substantial

16. allowable [Adjective]

Sentence: Gum is allowable, so we can have it in class.

Definition: permitted or admissible

Antonyms: prohibited

Synonyms: permissible

17. perishable [Adjective]

Sentence: Refrigeration will keep perishable food fresh.

Definition: liable to decay

Antonyms: imperishable, lasting

Synonyms: short-lived, decomposable

18. edible [Adjective]

Sentence: Edible nuts are not poisonous to eat.

Definition: fit or good to be eaten

Antonyms: inedible, poisonous

Synonyms: eatable

19. irritable [Adjective]

Sentence: The irritable grizzly bear growled in anger.

Definition: easily angered or frustrated

Antonyms: calm, agreeable, even-tempered

Synonyms: cross, edgy, touchy, ill-tempered

20. reducible [Adjective]

Sentence: Reducible fractions can be made smaller.

Definition: able to be made smaller

21. compatible [Adjective]

Sentence: They were compatible, so they got along well.

Definition: able to get along well

22. digestible [Adjective]

Sentence: Gum is not digestible, so don't swallow it!

Definition: able to be consumed and absorbed by the body

Antonyms: undigestible

Synonyms: edible, eatable

23. admissible [Adjective]

Sentence: Pets are not admissible in the public pool.

Definition: permitted or allowed inside

Antonyms: prohibited

Synonyms: acceptable, allowed

24. tangible [Adjective]

Sentence: Tangible evidence can be seen and felt.

Definition: able to be perceived through the sense of touch

Antonyms: intangible, untouchable, abstract

Synonyms: touchable, real

25. producible [Adjective]

Sentence: When there was a need for chicken, the local company made sure there was enough producible for everyone.

Definition: Able to be produced

26. conceivable [Adjective]

Sentence: Your idea isn't possible or even conceivable.

Definition: possible to understand, capable to imagine

Antonyms: unbelievable, unimaginable

Synonyms: imaginable, possible, believable

27. incombustible [Adjective]

Sentence: The material that I wanted to start my fire for smores was incombustible so I was sad.

Definition: consisting or made of material that does not burn if exposed to fire

28. apprehensible [Adjective]

Sentence: My idea was apprehensible and understandable.

Definition: able to be understood

Antonyms: unintelligible, obscure

Synonyms: understandable, comprehensible

29. insight [Noun]

Sentence: I had no insight as to why he was angry.

Definition: ability to know truths that are not obvious

Antonyms: unawareness

Synonyms: perception, astuteness, intuition, awareness

30. wandered [Verb]

Sentence: I wandered aimlessly from street to street.

Definition: moved around without a goal or purpose

Antonyms: stayed

Synonyms: ambled, meandered

31. passage [Noun]

Sentence: A tunnel allows passage under water.

Definition: a route, corridor or pathway for traveling

Synonyms: way

32. adventure [Noun]

Sentence: I prefer an adventure to boredom and safety.

Definition: an exciting and dangerous experience

Synonyms: venture, escapade, exploit, caper

33. curiosity [Noun]

Sentence: The strange creature was a source of curiosity.

Definition: a desire to know or learn

Synonyms: interest, inquisitiveness
