1. inspired [Verb]  
Sentence: The beautiful landscape inspired me to paint.  
Definition: to be encouraged or motivated to act  
Synonyms: encouraged, motivated
2. express [Verb]  
Sentence: Please express your thoughts in words.  
Definition: state or say something, to let out  
Antonyms: withhold  
Synonyms: speak, state
3. exhibit [Noun]  
Sentence: Is your painting part of the exhibit?  
Definition: something that is displayed or shown  
Synonyms: show, display
4. imitated [Verb]  
Sentence: The boy imitated the puppy, barking happily.  
Definition: reproducing or copying  
Synonyms: copied, echoed, simulated
5. compositions [Noun]  
Sentence: A theory is a compositions of interrelated facts.  
Definition: a thing composed of various elements.
6. improvise [Verb]  
Sentence: I improvise when I don't remember my lines.  
Definition: to perform without preparing  
Synonyms: invent
7. evaporate [Verb]  
Sentence: Water will evaporate and turn into vapor.  
Definition: to turn from liquid into vapor  
Antonyms: condense

Synonyms: vaporize

8. remote [Adjective]

Sentence: My remote town is far away and hard to reach.

Definition: far away and not easy to get to

Antonyms: near, close, local

Synonyms: distant, isolated

9. obsolete [Adjective]

Sentence: Most technology becomes obsolete, or out-of-date.

Definition: no longer produced or used; out of date

Antonyms: modern

Synonyms: outdated

10. evacuate [Verb]

Sentence: Evacuate the coast before the hurricane hits!

Definition: to remove from a place of danger, to empty

Synonyms: remove, expel, vacate

11. centigrade [Noun]

Sentence: Is the temperature in centigrade or Fahrenheit?

Definition: alternate temperature scale to Fahrenheit

Synonyms: Celsius

12. elevate [Verb]

Sentence: Elevate your leg by propping it on a pillow.

Definition: lift up or raise

Antonyms: lower, drop

Synonyms: lift, raise

13. negotiate [Verb]

Sentence: We will bargain and negotiate new agreements.

Definition: to discuss and come to an agreement

Synonyms: bargain, haggle

14. excavate [Verb]

Sentence: Diggers will try to excavate buried treasure.

Definition: to dig up or uncover

Antonyms: bury, cover

Synonyms: uncover, unearth

15. intervene [Verb]

Sentence: I'll have to intervene to stop the fight.

Definition: come between so as to modify or prevent

Synonyms: interfere

16. devastate [Verb]

Sentence: A tornado can devastate a town to ruins.

Definition: to destroy completely

Antonyms: rebuild

Synonyms: destroy, demolish

17. liberate [Verb]

Sentence: I'll free and liberate the men from prison.

Definition: to free or release

Antonyms: capture

Synonyms: free

18. schedule [Noun]

Sentence: My school schedule includes six classes.

Definition: a timetable of planned events

Synonyms: timetable

19. prosecute [Verb]

Sentence: The lawyer will prosecute him for the crime.

Definition: to take action against or to put on trial

Antonyms: defend

Synonyms: condemn, try, convict, litigate

20. delete [Verb]

Sentence: Delete that comma, and use a period instead.

Definition: to erase or destroy

Antonyms: add

Synonyms: erase

21. serene [Adjective]

Sentence: The serene lake did not have even one ripple.

Definition: peaceful and quiet

Antonyms: troubled, anxious, agitated

Synonyms: peaceful, calm, mellow, tranquil

22. provoke [Verb]

Sentence: Don't hit back even if they provoke you first.

Definition: to anger, to stimulate

Antonyms: calm

Synonyms: incite, arouse

23. oppose [Verb]

Sentence: I oppose the new hours and will protest them.

Definition: disapprove of and attempt to prevent

Antonyms: support

Synonyms: dispute, contradict

24. appetite [Noun]

Sentence: He was hungry and had an appetite for lunch.

Definition: a strong desire or liking for something

Synonyms: hunger, craving, longing, yearning

25. coincide [Verb]

Sentence: School breaks often coincide with holidays.

Definition: correspond with or happen at similar time

Synonyms: correspond, concur

26. accumulate [Verb]

Sentence: Squirrels accumulate nuts for winter.

Definition: to collect or gather

Antonyms: disperse, distribute

Synonyms: collect, gather, acquire

27. eradicate [Verb]

Sentence: If we eradicate poverty we will end hunger.

Definition: to end or eliminate

Synonyms: end

28. advertisement [Noun]

Sentence: The radio advertisement was convincing.

Definition: media to inform people or induce them to buy

Synonyms: announcement, commercial, ad

29. insight [Noun]

Sentence: I had no insight as to why he was angry.

Definition: ability to know truths that are not obvious

Antonyms: unawareness

Synonyms: perception, astuteness, intuition, awareness

30. wandered [Verb]

Sentence: I wandered aimlessly from street to street.

Definition: moved around without a goal or purpose

Antonyms: stayed

Synonyms: ambled, meandered

31. passage [Noun]

Sentence: A tunnel allows passage under water.

Definition: a route, corridor or pathway for traveling

Synonyms: way

32. adventure [Noun]

Sentence: I prefer an adventure to boredom and safety.

Definition: an exciting and dangerous experience

Synonyms: venture, escapade, exploit, caper

33. curious [Adjective]

Sentence: I am curious to find out your secret.

Definition: eager to find out something

Antonyms: uninterested

Synonyms: inquisitive, interested, wondering
