1. sanctuaries [Noun]  
Sentence: There are many sanctuaries for endangered animals around the world.  
Definition: areas for animals where they are protected and can't be hunted  
Synonyms: refuges
2. diminished [Verb]  
Sentence: The rain diminished the drought in the town.  
Definition: made or became less  
Antonyms: increased, boosted  
Synonyms: lessened, decreased, reduced
3. thrive [Verb]  
Sentence: Adding nutrients helps plants thrive.  
Definition: to grow strong and healthy  
Antonyms: decline, fail  
Synonyms: prosper, flourish
4. unfettered [Adjective]  
Sentence: The child had unfettered access to his video games at all times.  
Definition: not restricted  
Antonyms: restricted  
Synonyms: free, unrestricted
5. cooperate [Verb]  
Sentence: Students need to work together and cooperate.  
Definition: to work with someone else to achieve something you both want  
Antonyms: impede, obstruct  
Synonyms: collaborate, coordinate
6. program [Noun]  
Sentence: That is my favorite television program.  
Definition: an ordered or scheduled sequence or segment  
Synonyms: show, performance, segment, software

7. programming [Verb]  
Sentence: He is programming his computer software.  
Definition: creating instructions to be carried out  
Synonyms: coding
8. equip [Verb]  
Sentence: I'll equip the stage with a piano and drums.  
Definition: to set up for or to get materials for  
Antonyms: deprive  
Synonyms: supply, provide
9. equipped [Verb]  
Sentence: Every room is equipped with a fire extinguisher.  
Definition: supplied, provided or furnished with  
Antonyms: unequipped, unprepared  
Synonyms: prepared, supplied, furnished
10. permit [Verb]  
Sentence: Will you permit me to come into your house?  
Definition: to allow or give permission for  
Antonyms: disallow, prohibit, ban  
Synonyms: allow, let, consent, authorize
11. permitting [Verb]  
Sentence: He isn't permitting us to talk during class.  
Definition: allowing or authorizing; giving consent to  
Antonyms: forbidding  
Synonyms: allowing, letting, consenting
12. involve [Verb]  
Sentence: I will involve them in the decision.  
Definition: take part in, include  
Synonyms: include
13. involvement [Noun]  
Sentence: His involvement in hockey is long-standing.  
Definition: act of taking part in an activity  
Synonyms: participation

14. benefit [Noun]

Sentence: Improved health is one benefit of exercise.

Definition: an advantage or good result

Antonyms: detriment, disadvantage, impede, hinder

Synonyms: advantage, reward, perk

15. benefited [Verb]

Sentence: The fundraiser benefited the disadvantaged.

Definition: providing an advantage

16. rely [Verb]

Sentence: He trusted that he could rely on her word.

Definition: to depend upon

Antonyms: distrust, doubt

Synonyms: depend, trust

17. relies [Verb]

Sentence: He relies on his family for support.

Definition: depends on something or someone

Synonyms: depends

18. theory [Noun]

Sentence: Scientists have a theory to explain rainbows.

Definition: an explanation or area of knowledge

Antonyms: fact, practice, application

Synonyms: hypothesis, assumption, explanation

19. theories [Noun]

Sentence: His theories have yet to be proven.

Definition: ideas that have not yet been proven

Antonyms: facts

Synonyms: ideas

20. revise [Verb]

Sentence: Revise your writing to reflect her edits.

Definition: to work to change or improve something

Synonyms: change, redo, rework, update, correct, edit

21. revising [Verb]

Sentence: Students are revising and editing reports.

Definition: changing or updating

Antonyms: destroying

Synonyms: editing, changing, updating, rewriting, correcting, modifying

22. industry [Noun]

Sentence: Nurses are part of the health care industry.

Definition: a certain type of business activity

Synonyms: business, trade, field

23. industries [Noun]

Sentence: Farmers change industries and practice law.

Definition: areas of business, businesses of a certain type

24. conveys [Verb]

Sentence: The card conveys our best wishes.

Definition: passes along, transfers

Antonyms: receives, catches

Synonyms: delivers, imparts

25. conveying [Verb]

Sentence: Her smile is conveying happiness.

Definition: carrying or expressing something

Synonyms: carrying, communicating, transmitting

26. preferred [Verb]

Sentence: I preferred the apple pie over the peach pie.

Definition: liked one thing more than another

Antonyms: disliked

Synonyms: favored, liked

27. committing [Verb]

Sentence: He was caught committing a crime.

Definition: performing or engaging in the act of

Synonyms: perpetrating, performing

28. accommodating [Verb]

Sentence: The hotel is accommodating hundreds of guests.

Definition: providing lodging for

Synonyms: housing, lodging

29. expert [Noun]

Sentence: The chess expert has mastered the game.

Definition: one with experience and skill in something

Antonyms: amateur

Synonyms: master, specialist

30. focus [Verb]

Sentence: Focus on the letters on the eye chart.

Definition: to give all of your attention to a particular person or thing

31. visible [Adjective]

Sentence: His scar faded and was no longer visible.

Definition: able to be seen or perceived

Antonyms: invisible, unnoticeable

Synonyms: perceivable, noticeable

32. relate [Verb]

Sentence: We relate because we have similar views.

Definition: connect in meaning, emotion, or thought

Antonyms: clash, disagree

Synonyms: connect, understand, empathize

33. detect [Verb]

Sentence: A motion sensor can detect movement.

Definition: sense, find or discover something

Synonyms: find, discover, sense, notice
