- tingled [Verb]
 Sentence: My feet tingled with pins and needles.
 Definition: created or had a prickling sensation
 Synonyms: prickled
- tolerate [Verb]
 Sentence: I'll tolerate noise, but can't endure silence.
 Definition: put up with
 Synonyms: permit
- wriggled [Verb]
 Sentence: The worms wriggled in the soil.
 Definition: moved in twisting motions
 Synonyms: wiggled, twisted, squirmed, writhed
- appearance [Noun]
 Sentence: A lime has the appearance of a green lemon.
 Definition: external features or aspect
 Synonyms: demeanor, guise, look
- pessimist [Noun]
 Sentence: That negative man is such a pessimist!
 Definition: someone who always expects the worst Antonyms: optimist

Synonyms: defeatist

Sentence: Immigrants settle, or colonize, upon arrival. Definition: to form a colony or colonies Synonyms: settle, establish

 Sentence: A good influence keeps you on the right track.
 Definition: the power to affect people or things
- 10. existence [Noun]

Sentence: The existence of real elves is unlikely. Definition: the state of being alive Antonyms: non-existence, death Synonyms: reality, actuality, presence, being

11. disappearance [Noun]

Sentence: I can't find my shoe after its disappearance. Definition: a ceasing to be seen or exist

12. optimist [Noun]

Sentence: The optimist believed a cure would be found. Definition: a person with a positive outlook Antonyms: pessimist

13. insurance [Noun]

Sentence: Insurance paid for repairs on the vehicle. Definition: a policy to protect property or life Synonyms: indemnity

14. antagonist [Noun]

Sentence: He was the antagonist, not the hero. Definition: adversary or opponent Antonyms: hero, protagonist Synonyms: adversary, opponent, villain

15. clearance [Noun]

Sentence: Sweaters are on clearance at a reduced price. Definition: reduced price with goal of selling items Synonyms: sale

16. familiarize [Verb]

Sentence: I'll study and familiarize myself with it. Definition: to make well acquainted with Antonyms: estrange Synonyms: acquaint

17. brilliance [Noun]

Sentence: The brilliance of her jewelry blinded me. Definition: the shine or sparkle an object gives off Antonyms: dullness Synonyms: luster, shine, sparkle

18. coherence [Noun]

Sentence: The essay lacks coherence and structure. Definition: logical or natural consistency Antonyms: incoherence Synonyms: unity, intelligibility, structure

19. memorize [Verb]

Sentence: I will memorize my lines and not forget them. Definition: commit to remembrance or learn by heart Antonyms: forget Synonyms: remember

20. performance [Noun]

Sentence: The audience clapped after my performance. Definition: entertainment presented to an audience Synonyms: portrayal, exhibition, presentation

21. sanitize [Verb]

Sentence: I sanitize my hands with antibacterial soap. Definition: make clean and hygienic Antonyms: contaminate Synonyms: clean, sterilize, disinfect, decontaminate 22. physicist [Noun]

Sentence: A physicist studies matter and energy. Definition: a scientist studying how the world works

23. protagonist [Noun]

Sentence: A protagonist is the main character in a drama. Definition: main character in a drama Synonyms: lead

24. italicize [Verb]

Sentence: Italicize titles by writing in a slanted way. Definition: to print in sloped or slanted letters

25. preference [Noun]

Sentence: I have a preference for iced tea over hot tea. Definition: something that is liked more than another Synonyms: liking, inclination

26. coincidence [Noun]

Sentence: I just happened to see her by coincidence. Definition: an accident or unplanned occurrence Synonyms: accident, chance

27. pharmacist [Noun]

Sentence: The pharmacist mixed the antibiotic for me. Definition: a person who mixes and dispenses medication Synonyms: apothecary, druggist

28. abolitionist [Noun]

Sentence: The abolitionist demanded an end to slavery. Definition: one who wants slavery or injustice done away with Synonyms: emancipationist

29. demonstrate [Verb]

Sentence: Television chefs demonstrate new recipes. Definition: to show something by example Synonyms: show, explain, illustrate, teach

30. perspective [Noun]

Sentence: From my perspective, I see it differently. Definition: a view or the way someone sees something Synonyms: outlook, position, view

31. recall [Verb]

Sentence: Can you recall what you ate yesterday? Definition: to remember Antonyms: forget Synonyms: remember, recollect

32. appeal [Verb]

Sentence: His jokes appeal to my sense of humor. Definition: attract or interest Antonyms: bore Synonyms: interest
