mistreated [Verb]
 Sentence: They were cared for well, not mistreated.
 Definition: treated badly, cruelly, or unfairly
 Synonyms: abused

- qualified [Adjective]
 Sentence: She is qualified and able to do the job well.
 Definition: having the knowledge or experience needed
 Antonyms: unqualified, unskilled
 Synonyms: skilled
- segregation [Noun]
 Sentence: Segregation involves keeping things apart.
 Definition: keeping apart one or some from a group Synonyms: separation, isolation
- sympathize [Verb]
 Sentence: I sympathize with my grieving friend.
 Definition: to empathize with or feel for
 Antonyms: ignore, disregard
 Synonyms: support, understand, console, empathize
- graph [Noun]
 Sentence: We made a bar graph to show class birthdays.
 Definition: a visual representation of information
 Synonyms: chart
- graphics [Noun]
 Sentence: The color graphics made the report memorable.
 Definition: pictures, drawings or illustrations

Synonyms: drawings, pictures, artwork

- bibliography [Noun]
 Sentence: My paper's bibliography cites its sources.
 Definition: list of works cited in a text
- homograph [Noun]
 Sentence: A homograph is one word with multiple meanings.
 Definition: single word with multiple different meanings

10. seismograph [Noun]

Sentence: A seismograph reads an earthquake's strength. Definition: an instrument that measures earthquakes

11. graphite [Noun]

Sentence: Graphite is the gray "lead" in a pencil. Definition: soft gray type of carbon, as in pencils

12. monograph [Noun]

Sentence: The monograph is an account of my findings. Definition: written account of specific subject Synonyms: document

13. holograph [Noun]

Sentence: His handwritten signed will is a holograph. Definition: document handwritten by the author

14. topography [Noun]

Sentence: A city's topography includes roads and lakes. Definition: an area's natural and man-made surface features

15. television [Noun]

Sentence: I watched a movie on cable television at home. Definition: device that displays a transmission of images Synonyms: TV

16. telecast [Noun]

Sentence: We recorded the live telecast to watch later.

Definition: a TV show or program Synonyms: show, program, broadcast

17. telepathy [Noun]

Sentence: Telepathy allows one to hear thoughts. Definition: the ability to communicate mentally Synonyms: ESP, clairvoyance

18. telephoto [Adjective]

Sentence: The pictures of distant objects were taken with a telephoto lens. Definition: being able to take pictures at a distance

19. telemetry [Noun]

Sentence: "measurements will be transferred by radio telemetry to the shore station" Definition: the process of recording and transmitting the readings of an instrument.

20. televise [Verb]

Sentence: They televise the video on the news channel. Definition: to send video by airwaves, cable or satellite Synonyms: broadcast, screen, air

21. microbiology [Noun]

Sentence: She studied microbiology to learn about germs. Definition: the study of extremely tiny organisms

22. microcosm [Noun]

Sentence: Our small town is a microcosm of America. Definition: small representative model of a larger system Synonyms: model, example

23. microchip [Noun]

Sentence: The electronic circuit is a tiny microchip. Definition: tiny integrated circuit used in electronics Synonyms: microprocessor

24. microbe [Noun]

Sentence: A germ can also be known as a microbe. Definition: a tiny organism, often disease-causing bacteria Synonyms: microorganism, germ

25. microwave [Noun]

Sentence: He quickly reheated his meal in the microwave. Definition: an appliance which uses radio waves to cook

26. calligraphy [Noun]

Sentence: Calligraphy is a type of decorative handwriting. Definition: decorative handwriting

27. lexicographer [Noun]

Sentence: I always wanted to create my own dictionary, so I aspired to be a lexicographer

Definition: a person who compiles dictionaries.

28. microanalysis [Noun]

Sentence: Scientists try to find cures for diseases so they use a process called microanalysis to try to find a cure.

Definition: the quantitative analysis of chemical compounds using a sample of a few milligrams.

29. empower [Verb]

Sentence: Getting a license will empower me to drive. Definition: make able or allow to do something Antonyms: disallow Synonyms: entitle, allow

30. grace [Noun]

Sentence: He walked with a dancer's elegance and grace. Definition: elegance, effortless movement Antonyms: clumsiness, awkwardness Synonyms: elegance

31. limitation [Noun]

Sentence: All bridges have a weight limitation. Definition: imposed restriction; characteristic weakness Synonyms: restraint, limit, budget, weakness

32. noble [Adjective]

Sentence: Her noble acts were rewarded with a medal. Definition: showing or possessing an elevated character Antonyms: ignoble, selfish Synonyms: idealistic, grand, magnanimous, selfless

33. resist [Verb]

Sentence: The desire to eat candy was hard to resist. Definition: to fight against or keep away from Antonyms: welcome, embrace, accept Synonyms: oppose, fight, defy, combat, curb
