1. abundant [Adjective]
Sentence: The store was full of abundant supplies.
Definition: plentiful in amount
Antonyms: paltry, meager
Synonyms: plentiful, excessive, great, substantial
2. altitude [Noun]
Sentence: A plane steadily ascends to maximum altitude.
Definition: height or vertical distance
Synonyms: height, elevation
3. condenses [Verb]
Sentence: Visible drops appear when water condenses.
Definition: turns from a gas to a liquid
4. substance [Noun]
Sentence: Slugs trail a slippery substance behind them.
Definition: a kind of material with definite properties
Synonyms: material
5. trickles [Verb]
Sentence: A tear trickles down her cheek every time she watches a sad movie.
Definition: (of a liquid) flow in a small stream.
6. contact [Verb]
Sentence: It is easy to contact people with cell phones.
Definition: to communicate with someone or something
Synonyms: reach, communicate
7. alligator [Noun]
Sentence: An alligator looks a lot like a crocodile.
Definition: large reptile with a wide snout, sharp teeth

8. escalator [Noun]
Sentence: An escalator is a moving staircase.
Definition: a moving staircase
9. classical [Adjective]
Sentence: He teaches ancient and classical literature.
Definition: relating to traditional style or ideas
Antonyms: modern, contemporary
Synonyms: ancient, traditional
10. innocent [Adjective]
Sentence: The innocent boy wasn't guilty of anything.
Definition: not dangerous, guilty, or harmful
Antonyms: guilty, corrupt
Synonyms: blameless, honest, guiltless, harmless, pure
11. trifle [Noun]
Sentence: The trifle contained berries, cake and cream.
Definition: a dessert made of cake, fruit, and cream
12. obstacle [Noun]
Sentence: An obstacle was blocking the doorway.
Definition: something which impedes or hinders
Synonyms: obstruction
13. miracle [Noun]
Sentence: It would be a miracle if I walked on water.
Definition: an event unexplainable by the laws of nature
Synonyms: wonder, marvel
14. icicle [Noun]
Sentence: A frozen icicle hung from the roof's edge.
Definition: ice spike formed when dripping water freezes
15. struggle [Verb]
Sentence: He will struggle to complete the difficult obstacle course.
Definition: to proceed with effort through difficulties
Antonyms: surrender
Synonyms: endeavor, strive

16. medium [Adjective]

Sentence: A medium size is between small and large.

Definition: halfway between small and large

Synonyms: middle

17. variable [Adjective]

Sentence: The variable wind kept changing.

Definition: able or having a tendency to change often

Antonyms: constant

Synonyms: changeable

18. idea [Noun]

Sentence: I thought of an idea to solve the problem.

Definition: something thought or imagined

Synonyms: thought, plan, opinion, conviction, notion, gist, purpose

19. studio [Noun]

Sentence: The artist paints in her well-lit studio.

Definition: work space of artistic people or performers

Synonyms: workshop, workroom

20. stadium [Noun]

Sentence: The football stadium seats many people.

Definition: a large, open structure for sports events

Synonyms: arena

21. radiate [Verb]

Sentence: The sun's heat will radiate through the glass.

Definition: emit light, heat, or sound energy

Antonyms: absorb

Synonyms: emit

22. strategy [Noun]

Sentence: The team planned a strategy to win the game.

Definition: a well thought out plan of action

Synonyms: plan, scheme

23. finish [Verb]

Sentence: I must finish my dinner before I eat dessert.

Definition: to complete or to bring to an end

Antonyms: begin

Synonyms: complete, end

24. dutiful [Adjective]

Sentence: She is dutiful and helps clean every week.

Definition: careful to do what one ought to do

Antonyms: rebellious

Synonyms: obedient

25. arthritis [Noun]

Sentence: Arthritis made her joints ache.

Definition: ache and inflammation in the joints

26. radiation [Noun]

Sentence: Radiation from the sun keeps the planet warm.

Definition: energy given out by atoms

Synonyms: emanation, emission

27. recreational [Adjective]

Sentence: Fishing is relaxing and recreational for him.

Definition: for fun or relaxation

Synonyms: entertaining, amusing

28. intimidation [Noun]

Sentence: A bully used intimidation to scare the boy.

Definition: act of subduing someone by instilling fear

Antonyms: support

Synonyms: browbeating, coercion

29. disturb [Verb]

Sentence: Please do not disturb him while he naps.

Definition: to bother or disrupt

Synonyms: disrupt, bother, annoy

30. cycle [Noun]

Sentence: The life cycle of a tree begins with a seed.

Definition: events that happen in a repeating order

Synonyms: series, sequence

31. impact [Noun]

Sentence: Pollution makes a lasting impact on earth.

Definition: resulting effect or influence

Synonyms: result, influence, effect, consequence

32. composed [Verb]

Sentence: He composed a letter to his mother.

Definition: planned and created some writing or art work

Synonyms: formulated, scripted, orchestrated

33. engineer [Noun]

Sentence: The engineer designed plans for a new bridge.

Definition: trained person who designs or builds
