Math: up to trigonometry

Reading: multi. choice, reading passages and interpreting informational graphics

Writing and Language grammar, usage, word choice, Expression of ideas.

Essay- Optional (but some colleges may require it).

Bright Futures Scholarship Program:

Must submit online application senior year after Oct. 1

Florida Academic Scholars (FAS): 3.5 weighted* GPA (16 required academic credits), 1330 SAT critical reading and math or 29 ACT composite score or 95 CLT composite score and 100 hours of community service and/or work hours.

Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS): 3.0 weighted* GPA (16 required academic credits) and 1190 SAT critical reading and math or 24 ACT composite score or 82 CLT composite score and 75 hours of community service or 100 work hours.

16 required academic credits include:

4 English

4 Math (Alg. 1A and IB count as 1 math for BF).

3 Science

3 Social Science

2 Foreign Language credits (in the same language)

NCAA College Athletics:

Div. 1: earn 16 NCAA approved core course credits. Complete 10 of the 16 courses before start of 7th semester; 2.3 core course GPA.

Div. 2: earn 16 approved core course credits & 2.2 core course GPA.

**** Athletes are encouraged to complete the online application by the summer of their junior year**

BF Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholars Award:

3.0 weighted GPA in the 16 required credits for graduation.

- 3.5 GPA in a 3-credit vocational program (see below)
- 30 hours of community serve and
- Passing score on a college placement test (SAT- reading- 24, writing/language-25, math- 24, or ACT reading 19, Eng. 17, math 19 or PERT Reading 106, Writing 103, Math 114)
