Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS): 3.0 weighted* GPA (16 required academic credits) and 1190 SAT critical reading and math or 24 ACT composite score or 82 CLT composite score and 75 hours of community service or 100 work hours.

16 required academic credits include:

- 4 English
- 4 Math (Alg. 1A and IB count as 1 math for BF).
- 3 Science
- 3 Social Science
- 2 Foreign Language credits (in the same language)

NCAA College Athletics:

Div. 1: earn 16 NCAA approved core course credits. Complete 10 of the 16 courses before start of 7th semester; 2.3 core course GPA.

Div. 2: earn 16 approved core course credits & 2.2 core course GPA

** Athletes are encouraged to complete the online application by the summer of their junior year
