Well-known painter Mary Cassatt is considered to be one of the originators of Impressionism in the USA. Most of Cassatt's work studies the human form predominantly, but she also had a passion for creating paintings of flowers and garden scenes. "Lilacs in a Window" became one of her most celebrated paintings in the early 1880s when floral painting rose to prominence within Impressionism.

**Kindergarten** and **First grade** are busy exploring impressionism with the works of Mary Cassatt.

**Second** and **Third grade** are in the depths of Undersea Water Seascapes.

**Fourth grade** students are putting things in single point perspective and **Fifth grade** students are exploring Gargoyles on Gothic buildings.

Greetings from Guidance

Wow!! This 3rd 9weeks has almost come to an end!! It is my hope that the students have come home and shared all the character building lessons we have completed, thus far. Just to share a small portion of what we do, we have "open" group discussions and "role-playing" (the kids enjoy this very much) it allows them to be active and learn with understanding, building on friendship, self-control, & Bullying ( what does it mean & how to prevent such behaviors). Please ask them what are the 4 types of bullying and encourage positive behaviors in school, home, and in the community. Being kind and treating others the way you would want to be treated is our GOLDEN RULE.

We will end this 9 weeks Guidance lesson this month with introducing our students to XELLO. This is a career exploration platform that the District rolled out to help our students K-12 become future ready! XELLO is an engaging online program that helps students in K-12 build the knowledge, skills, and plans for future success. Through self-knowledge, exploration and planning, students better understand who they are, their academic and career options, and the steps they'll need to take to achieve their goals. Though XELLO is not required for elementary, we felt it would be beneficial to our students to expose them to the platform and let them get familiar with it so they will be prepared for the XELLO introduction in middle school. Students K-5 will learn how to log in and get comfortable with the platform through Guidance special area. When you can, have your child(ren) log into Classlink, choose the XELLO tile and get started exploring this interactive platform/tool! Have fun! It's never too early to start thinking about the future!

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# Key points about how words and actions impact others:

Emotional influence: Positive words and actions can evoke feelings of happiness, confidence, and motivation, while negative ones can trigger sadness, anger, anxiety, or feelings of inadequacy.

<u>Social impact:</u> Our words and actions set the tone for interactions, influencing the dynamics within a group or community, fostering cooperation or tension.

Psychological effects: Repeated exposure to positive or negative language can impact self-perception and self-worth.

Non-verbal communication: Body language, facial expressions, and tone of voice also play a crucial role in conveying emotions and influencing how others interpret our words.

#### Some examples:

A kind compliment: Can boost someone's self-esteem and make them feel valued.

Constructive criticism: Can help someone improve if delivered respectfully, but harsh criticism can be damaging.

<u>A supportive gesture:</u> Like offering help or a listening ear can create a sense of connection and comfort.

<u>Ignoring someone:</u> Can make them feel excluded and unimportant.

<u>Publicly criticizing someone:</u> Can lead to social isolation and damage their reputation.

# Why it's important to be mindful of your words and actions:

<u>Building strong relationships:</u> Choosing positive and considerate communication fosters trust and positive interactions.

<u>Promoting positive environments:</u> By being mindful of your impact, you can contribute to a supportive and healthy atmosphere.

<u>Personal responsibility:</u> Recognizing that your words and actions have consequences for others encourages accountability

#### LCS
