



The Freedom Tower by J.Q. McNicol

¹ On April 4, 1973, the historic twin towers of downtown Manhattan's World Trade Center were completed. The towers were massive. They were 110 stories each, a popular tourist attraction, and a symbol of economic strength. On September 11, 2001, the World Trade Center became the target of a large terrorist attack that took the lives of nearly 3,000 people. The disaster also <u>altered</u> the skyline of New York City, destroying the twin columns. The two <u>iconic</u> buildings were no longer present. After the attack, it was decided that the best way to stand up to the terrorists was to rebuild a new tower as a symbol of the bravery and strength in America.

² After the destruction of the original World Trade Center, there was debate regarding what to do at the site of the World Trade Center. In 2002, there was a competition to determine how to use the site. The idea was brought forth to memorialize the September 11 attacks and rebuild. In December 2002, a design by Daniel Libeskind was selected as the winner. Unfortunately for Libeskind, another architect named David Childs was later hired to design the skyscraper. Although he was upset, Libeskind was able to keep one part of his original plan. He wanted the height of the tower to be 1,776 feet to represent the year the Declaration of Independence was signed and the United States became a nation.

³ This new building was completed in 2014 and called the Freedom Tower (also known as One World Trade Center, 1 World Trade Center, and 1WTC). It is currently the tallest building in the western hemisphere and the sixth tallest in the world. There are 104 stories, 9 escalators, and 70 elevators. The skyscraper is made out of 48,000 tons of structural steel and considered to be one of the safest buildings since it has a center core surrounded by concrete.

⁴ The Freedom Tower honors the courage and bravery of those who lost their lives. It also represents a symbol of strength and unity for the nation. It stands tall against the New York skyline and is a towering symbol of freedom.








WHAT IS PATRIOT DAY?
