ALGEBRA 2 SYLLABUS
MRS. JOANNE JACOBSON

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course provides students with a foundation for applying advanced skills to other mathematical and scientific fields. Content includes: graphing linear, absolute value, polynomial and, rational functions; factoring polynomials; simplifying complex numbers; solving linear, polynomial, radical, exponential, and logarithmic equations; and solving systems of equations. (Textbook: Algebra 2, New Jersey: Pearson Education Inc., 2015.)

QUARTER GRADE:

80% ASSESSMENTStests, quizzes, group quizzes, special projects
20% ASSIGNMENTSclass group/individual assignments, homework, labs

ASSESSMENTS: Tests and quizzes will be given to monitor progress. Any missed quiz will be replaced with the chapter test score. ***All tests will be made up promptly at a date and time agreed upon by the student and myself. Skipping a test will result in an automatic zero!*** A mid-term and a final exam will be administered. All tests and quizzes are to be taken in pencil only. Tests not done in pencil will lose 5 points credit. Missed tests are made up on the day you return to class. Each quiz may include material from the first day of the semester to the current day.

ASSIGNMENTS: All homework should be completed by the beginning of the following class meeting and will be collected periodically for credit. No credit will be given for answers only. All work must be shown to receive credit. Homework may be graded for completeness and/or correctness. **ZEROS WILL BE GIVEN** if a student does not make up an assignment or assessment within the time window and it is late. **Late assignments will not be accepted for a grade.** A zero is also given if a student has an unexcused absence/skipped class for the day of the assignment.

COLLABORATIVE/COOPERATIVE GROUPS: Cooperative group activities will occur occasionally and be graded as class work. A student needs to be present in class to receive full credit.

NOTEBOOK/PORTFOLIO: Students are required to maintain a 3-RING math notebook containing all class notes, homework, classwork and assessments. A class maintained portfolio will be updated periodically by the student.

MATERIALS: Materials needed for class each day should be gotten out of book bags so book bags will not need to be accessed during class time. Materials needed : 3-Ring Binder, lined Notebook Paper, graph Paper, highlighter, colored pencils or colored pens, pencils, index cards, textbook and a scientific calculator. Calculators will be allowed on SOME assessments. I recommend the TI-30XI or TI-30XIIS.

ABSENCES AND MAKE UP WORK: The student bears the responsibility of promptly making up missed assignments and assessments. Make up assignments and assessments are defined as assignments or assessments collected on a day the student is not present or was absent for the period of time when it was assigned. Make up assessments and assignments must be made up no later than the total number of days absent plus one for any absence that is excused within 5 days of that absence. In general, I review the day prior to a test with no new material being introduced that day. Students missing the day before a test will test with the class.

RESTROOM POLICY: Use the restroom before the bell rings for class to begin or after class. If you MUST use the restroom during class, do not interrupt the lesson to do so. Wait for an opportune time to signal me and then quietly sign out on the “**Out of class**” log then take the BATHROOM HALL pass. A completed entry should log the time you left, destination, and your return time.

TARDY POLICY: The Chiles High School tardy policy will be enforced. A student is tardy if they are not in the classroom before the tardy bell rings. Late to class more than 10 minutes counts as an absence. Consequences: **1st Tardy** = Verbal Warning, **2nd Tardy** = Detention & Parent Phone Call, **3rd Tardy** = Discipline Referral, resulting in Saturday School, **4th Tardy** = Discipline Referral, resulting in a Saturday School and equaling an absence. Student must bring a signed “excused” Tardy pass from the OFFICE for a tardy to be excused.

CELL PHONE/Smart Watches POLICY: Cell phones and smart watches should be turned off and placed in your book bags BEFORE entering classroom. No Cell phone use is permitted during class. Consequences if you have your phone out during class: **1st offense** – warning and you must put your phone away. **2nd offense** - Your cell phone will be confiscated and you may pick it up from me at the end of class. **3rd and future offenses** - Your cell phone will be confiscated and your parent may pick it up in the front office at the end of the school day. Future offenses may warrant further consequences issued by administration.

CLASS RULES:

1. Be prepared for class by bringing book and supplies.
2. No gum chewing, food or drink allowed in the classroom with the exception of water.
3. Respect all property in the classroom. Do not write on desks, texts or walls and pick up around yours desks before leaving.
4. Students are to show courtesy to their fellow students and teachers.
5. All **CELL** phones/SMART watches are to be turned off and put away in backpack or purse (no phones in pockets)
6. All school rules and other rules as described in the Student Handbook are in effect.

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES:

1. Students are to sharpen pencils, be in their seats prepared to work, have homework out to be checked at the start of class.
2. Students are to raise their hand and wait to be called upon before answering a question or adding input into the lesson.
3. Students are not to change their assigned seat without prior approval of their teacher.
4. Students are to remain in their assigned seats until the bell rings or their teacher dismisses them.
5. When working in group's students are to follow the posted rules for cooperative groups.

CHEATING:

Cheating is unacceptable! The perpetrator will receive an immediate referral and parents will be contacted!

Cheating occurs when:

- You copy or look at someone's answers to a test or you have someone take a test for you.
- You copy someone's homework or have your parents, friends, or siblings do your homework for you.
- You ask your friends simply for the answers to an assignment.
- You ask others what questions were on a test that you have not yet taken.
- You have someone write an essay for you.
- You copy and paste information from an Internet site onto your essay without citing it as a source.

To minimize the opportunity to cheat during testing situations, the following testing policy will be in effect.

- Cell phones must be turned OFF and PUT AWAY in a backpack or bag...
- All BACKPACKS and BAGS must be closed and placed on the back of the classroom or side wall.
- If your phone is on your person, I will assume you are cheating! No exceptions.

A student's choice to not meet our classroom rules and procedures may result in:
